

RMCAD Tunnels

First mentioned in 1919, the tunnels have been used to move water & electricity, but also to transport patients! Check out the first mention below from the JCRS' own annual publication, Sanatorium, & images of our tunnels in use!

TUNNELS

Our electric wires, steam pipes and water pipes for lighting, heating and water supply have given us a great deal of trouble. Most of the time they have been out of order and needed extensive and expensive repairs. The cause of it was found to be the fact that these conveyors of the three essentials of the life in a Sanatorium have not been well protected. It was therefore decided by the board that tunnels be dug from the engine room to all the large buildings, in which the pipes and wires be laid. These tunnels are 595 feet of 6 x 5 feet and 86 feet of 4 x 4 feet. The tunnels connect the engine room with the New York Ladies' Auxiliary Pavilion No. 1, New York Ladies' Auxiliary Pavilion No. 2, kitchen and dining room, the Old Building. Denver Ladies' Auxiliary Ward and the I. Rude Medical Building and Administration Building. The larger tunnel is large enough to convey a patient from one building to the other without submitting him to the inclemencies of the weather.


Illustration of Patient Transport in Tunnels, 1930-1950. Credit: DU Archives

THE FACTS:

"The Murdered Nurse" is Bessie Gertrude Marold (1893-1919).

- She was a US Army nurse at Camp Mills in NY during World War I.
 - She came to CO to recover from illness.
 - Within 10 months she became the Head Nurse at JCRS.
- A male patient, "in love," murdered Bessie when she refused to marry him, again.

Bessie nursed Isaac back to health numerous times, & they became close friends, until Isaac saw Bessie "embracing" another male patient.

Bessie apologized for upsetting Isaac for not giving him the attention he demanded on numerous occasions.

On Aug. 20,1919, while leaving the dining hall (now where **TriBoro** is), Bessie heard Isaac call her name. She turned to him, & he asked for marriage again. She refused again. Isaac shot her 3 times in the torso then turned the gun on himself, but failed to shoot himself. He was held in jail at Golden, CO but passed away before the trial could be held.

Bessie was taken to the operating room at JCRS (near Spivak), but was killed instantly by the first shot. Her body was flown back to New York for burial in her home state of PA. Over 275 people attended the funeral to

celebrate the heroic and selfless life of Bessie G. Marold.
